

## POLICY TITLE: INSTANTANEOUS PENALTIES

## 1. PRINCIPLE:

- 1.1 Bowls ACT believes in a fair and equitable competition and will do everything in its power to ensure that all players participate within the Laws of the Sport of bowls.
- 1.2 Bowls ACT affiliated Members should undertake to conduct themselves' in a polite and sportsman like manner when participating in any bowls event.

## 2. INSTANTANEOUS PENALTIES:

2.1 For any Bowls ACT event:

If the Umpire, on appeal by the Controlling Body, a Side Manager, a Skip or an Opponent, or by observation, in their opinion decides that a serious breach of any Law, Rule or action by a Player/s, such as:

- acting in an abusive, threatening or intimidating manner towards any person,
- using obscene, offensive, abusive, threatening or intimidating language towards any person,
- threatening any person with physical violence or assault,
- assaulting any person,
- acting in a manner likely to bring the sport of bowls into disrepute
- acting in a manner likely to bring Bowls Australia into disrepute.

has taken place, then after consultation with the controlling body, (in their absence the team / side managers) has the authority to have the end immediately regarded as completed and

- the Opponent of the offender awarded as many shots as there are bowls in use by the Opponent in singles or opposing Team in a Team game or team in a side game.
- Upon a second such offence by the same Player in the same game, the Umpire may award the game to the Opponent/s according to Laws of the Sport (3rd Edition) C2 and C10.
- 2.2 In a Team game the defaulting Team will forfeit the game to their Opponent.
- 2.3 Serious offences may also be subject to police action. Consultation should occur between the venue manager/Controlling Body and umpire/s before such action is undertaken.
- 2.4 The umpire must forward a written detailed report (using the Bowls ACT Incident Report Form) about any incident involving an instantaneous penalty to the respective Controlling Body within Twenty-Four (24) Hours of the incident.

## 3. BOWLS ACT EVENTS

- 3.1 The following are defined as Bowls ACT events:
  - Men's and Women's State Pennant
  - Men's and Women's State Championships
  - Junior State Championships
  - Men's and Women's Champion of Club Champions

- Men's and Women's Rookie Singles
- Men's and Women's 60 and Over Pairs
- Men's and Women's 60 and Over Fours
- Mixed Winter Tournament
- Doran Bowl
- Mixed Pairs
- Australian Indoor Singles Championship (ACT Qualifying)
- Club Major Singles/Pairs/Triples/Fours
- Such other events as may be declared by the CMC as a Bowls ACT event.
- 3.2 Club major championships are considered to be Bowls ACT events because they are feeder competitions for the Bowls ACT Champion of Club Champion events.
