An absolute thriller that nobody will forget anytime soon saw Belconnen taking it all with them in the elimination final out at Queanbeyan. QBC showed their usual consistency, however, Belconnen managed to find an extra bowl somewhere to just snag victory away. Devastating way to finish the season for QBC, but for Belconnen a brilliant motivator for Sunday.

Belconnen came into the match off the back of a thrilling win whilst the circumstances were a bit more sobering for Canberra on the Saturday. The Cobras needed to find their form early in the piece to silence a few of the Belconnen celebrations if they wanted to take the win, but inevitably weren't able to do so. Belconnen showed all year that on their day they can match and beat anyone in the competition, and in a spate of bad luck for the Cobras it would appear that Sunday was Belconnen's day. They ran out victors to the tune of 15 points over CBC and seal their place in the Grand Final against Vikings. Another strong season for Canberra ends in disappointment, this time a week earlier as they're left to pick up the pieces and move on to 2023.
