### Grade 1

We said farewell to Queanbeyan on Saturday, the club has had a fine season but were always going to be closely matched by Canberra BC, with the Cobras claiming a narrow victory to progress to Sunday's preliminary final against Belconnen. The 2022 Champions had to go the long way, but are back in the winner's circle with their win over Canberra and will be looking to go back-to-back in 2023. Peter Watts had a huge weekend, nearly dragging Belconnen over the line on Saturday before being the difference in a lop-sided result against Canberra on Sunday. Belconnen will play Weston Creek in the Grand Final. The Creekers got Sunday off after claiming victory over Belco in the major semi on Saturday, but it was never easy, just six shots the margin. Weston Creek are now 2/1 up in the head to head in 2023, but no game is more important than the Grade 1 final this Sunday between the two best sides all year.

#### Grade 3

Canberra North won the battle of Northbourne Avenue on Saturday claiming victory over Yowani by a narrow eight shots to progress through to Sunday's prelim final where they would meet a Queanbeyan side smarting after defeat at the hands of Vikings on Saturday. ## Grade 4

#### Grade 5

The minor semi-final saw a very close encounter between Canberra and Vikings, the Tuggeranong side prevailing in a game that could have gone either way. Bungendore then hosting Vikings on Sunday for a spot in the Grade Final with the home club showing why they led the ladder all year, running out comfortable victors.
